# DEFENSIBLE SPACE TREE CUTTING

Fire prevention tips from numerous fire- fighting agencies suggest having defensible space of 30 feet surrounding your house. Thev suggest that there be no highly flammable plants or other materials in this 30 foot space. Landscaping plants should be well watered and green. All tall dry grass should be cut to 6 inches or less. Tree limbs should not hang over your house or other structures. Dead limbs should be cut off and disposed of. Tree branches should be cut off to at least 6 feet above the ground.

If any home owner wants to remove trees within the 30 foot defensible space near their house that may pose a fire threat, the HDE Board will not consider that a violation of our CC&Rs.
